



NaDEET's mission:


to protect the natural environment of Namibia by educating its citizens to practice a sustainable lifestyle.

The NaDEET washrooms are more than a place for participants to wash their hair or brush their teeth - they are a central part of the NaDEET Centre "living and learning" experience.


The interactive nature of the facilities teaches Namibian children and adults first-hand valuable lessons about water and energy conservation.

After more than 10 years of the harsh desert climate and 10,000 participants, the **eight** WaterWiseWashrooms need to be renovated.

Budget for one Washroom

The budget includes materials, tools, transport and labour per washroom.

More than infrastructure, it is learning by doing

At NaDEET Centre we want visitors to learn how to live a sustainable lifestyle. Participants are divided into "Sustainable Living Teams" and share a house, dry toilet and "WaterWiseWashroom".

Here participants learn skills such as:

- how to monitor their daily water use by reading an indicator and water meter .
- how to wash using a bucket shower
- how to use less water and still be clean!
