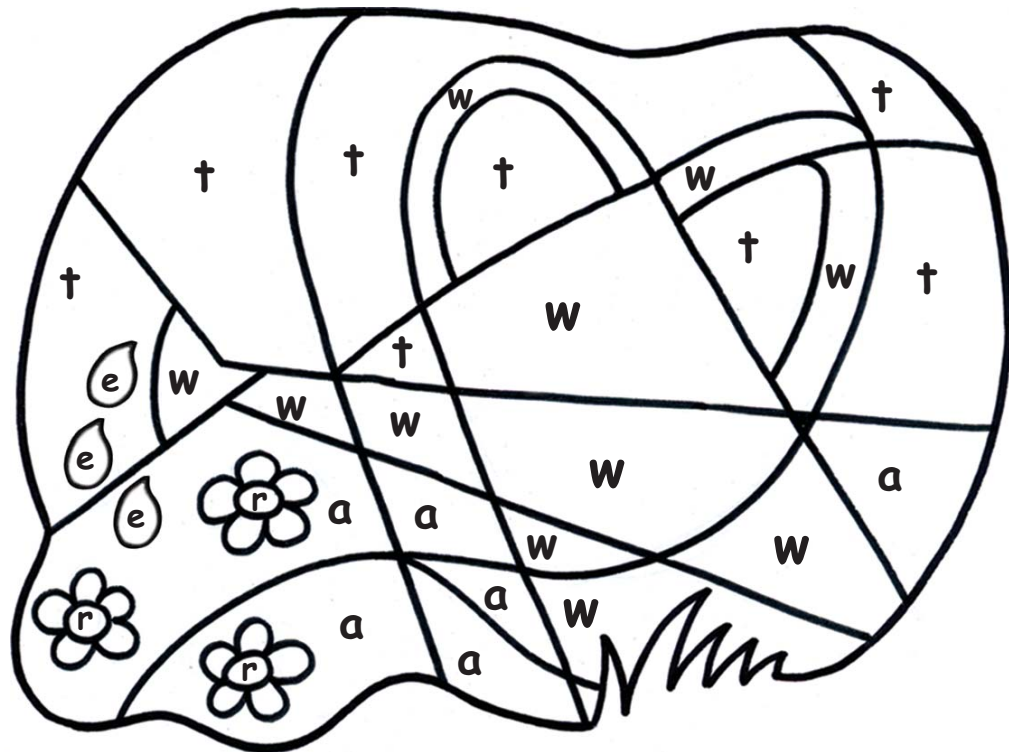

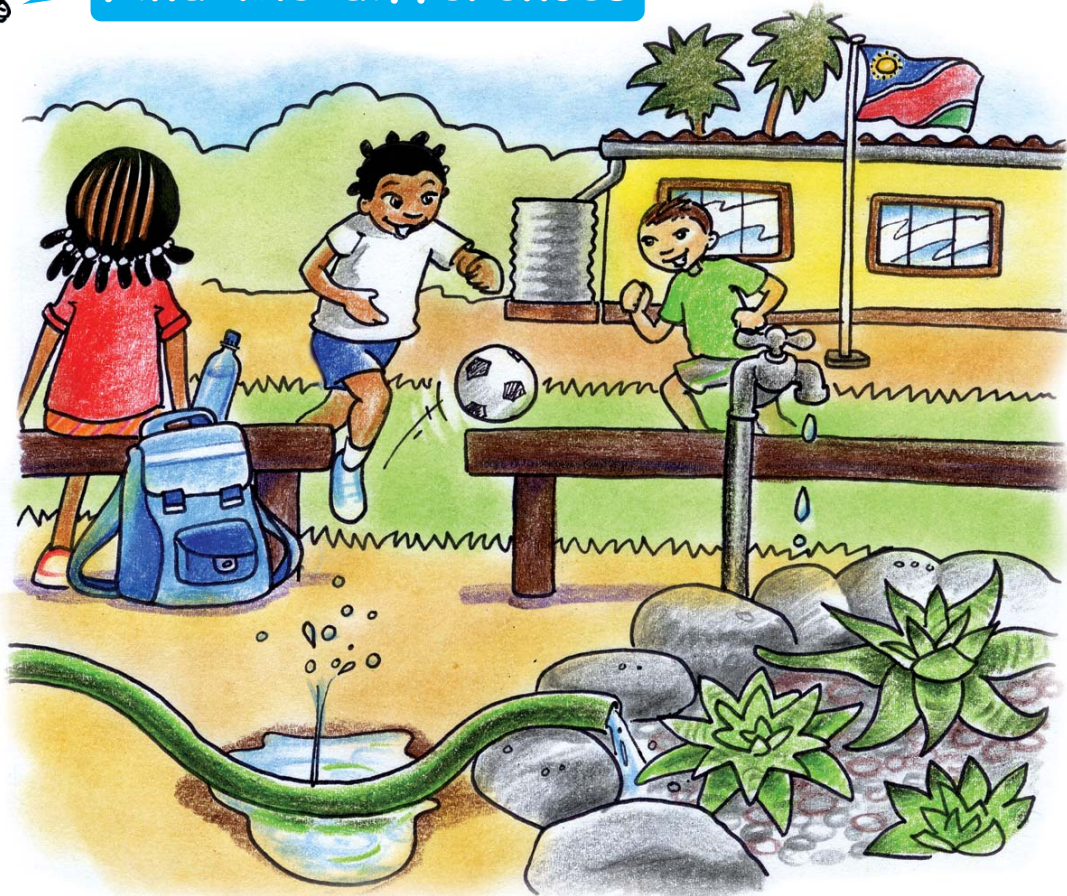


A young oryx is born with brown hair instead of grey like its parents.

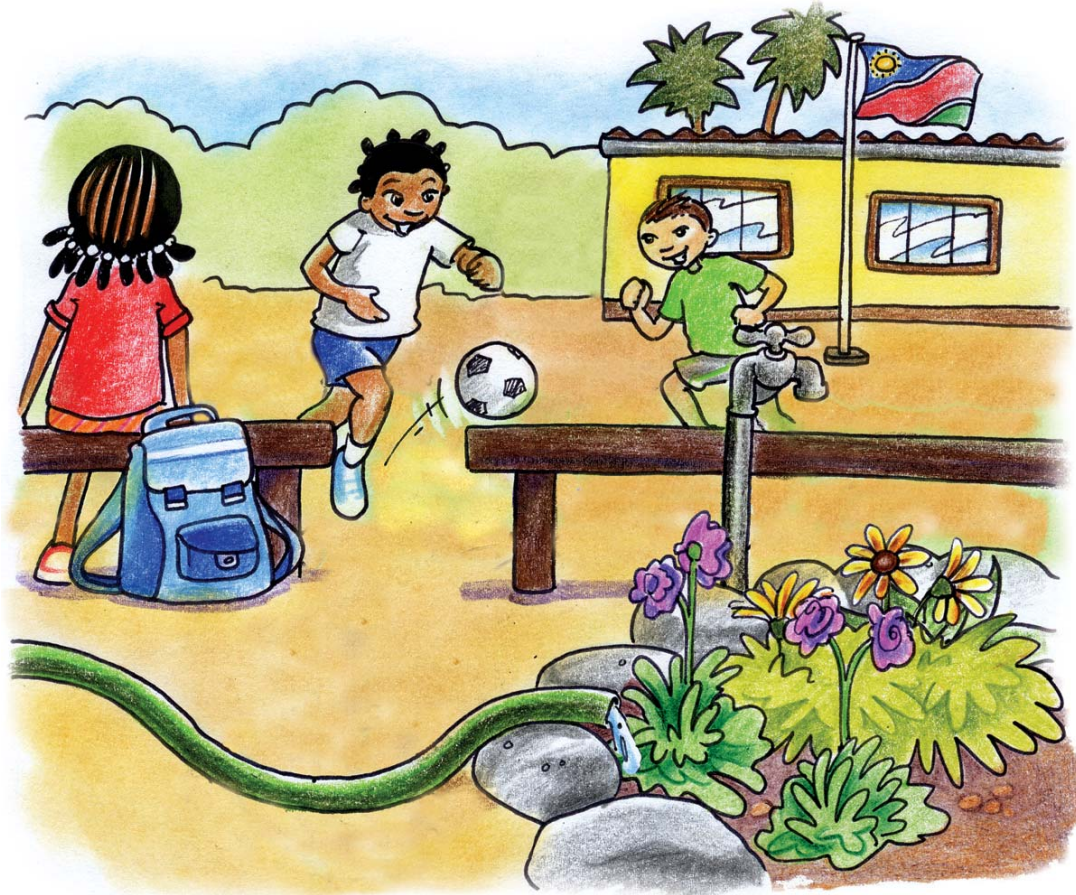

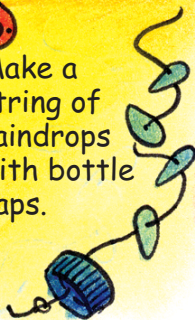


1. Draw a rainbow and cloud on a piece of paper. Cut out.

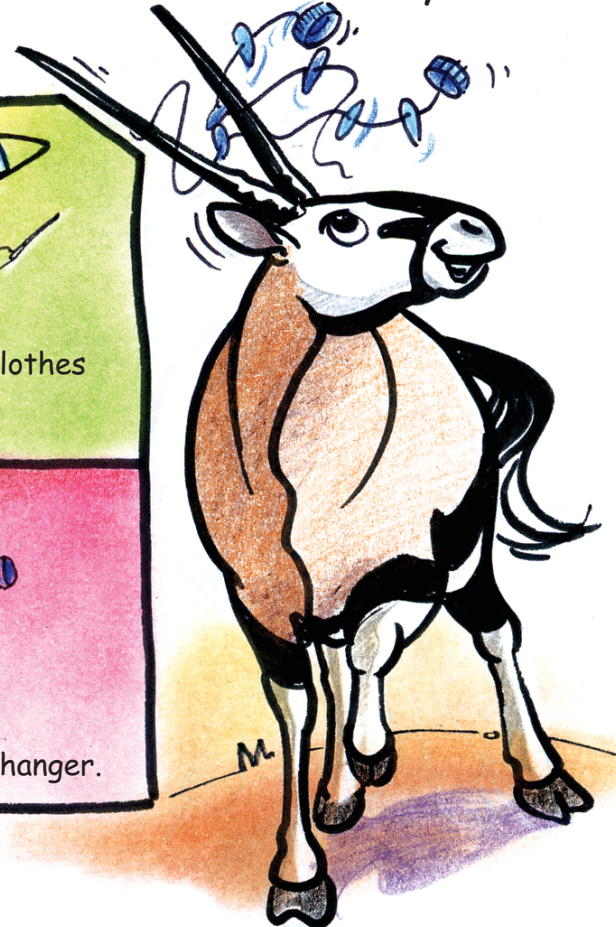


2. Tie it to clothes hanger.

3. Make a string of raindrops with bottle caps.




Tie onto clothes hanger.
